1. Open Prudential Committee Meeting (Chair) with Pledge of Allegiance

Pamela Pike opens the Prudential Committee meeting at 4:10PM with the Pledge of Allegiance. Present are Marcine Fernandes Member, Melissa Goodell Recording Secretary.

Pamela Pike motions to enter Executive Session at 4:15PM under M.G.L. c.30A, \$21(a)(3) to discuss strategy with respect to clearly and imminently threatened or otherwise demonstrably likely litigation as an open meeting may have a detrimental effect on the litigating position of the Prudential Committee and the chair so declares.

Open session reconvened at 5:20PM. Present are Pamela Pike Chairman, Charles Klueber Clerk, Marcine Fernandes Member, Chief Goodwin, Mary McCoy Clerk-Treasurer, Melissa Goodell Recording Secretary, Joe Sullivan OPM, John Kelly Clerk of Works, Paolo Carissimi Design Team.

5. Approval of Minutes

Charles Klueber motions to approve the minutes of August 27, 2020. Marcine Fernandes seconds the motion, vote 3-0-0.

6. Fire Station Building Committee's Report/ Update from OPM Joe Sullivan

Joe Sullivan presents the Prudential Committee with the monthly report regarding the new Fire Station. Included are several change orders for discussion. Paolo Carissimi would like the Prudential Committee to reconsider the ceramic tiles in the rest room. He states there is no urgency on the decision Joe Sullivan recommends putting that decision on hold for the time being. John Kelly states he would also like to have the auto gas shut of reconsidered. A decision on that change order would be needed in the next couple of weeks.

Joe Sullivan states the building is about 50% completed and there have been very few change orders comparatively.

7. <u>Board of Engineer's Reports and Discussions which may include topics</u> pertaining to personnel, payroll, procurements and operations at the Fire Department

Chief Goodwin hands out a copy of a letter from the Town Clerk thanking the Onset Fire Department for their assistance at the Town Election in June.

Chief Goodwin states he is looking to roll back [payroll and control costs. Chief Goodwin states he met with the Deputies and told them they need to roll back and briefed on all activities that are going on regarding the Fire Station.

There was a question and discussion about the Onset Fire Department escorting the Mayflower II through the canal and the overtime it created. Chief Goodwin states

they were requested to assist by the Coast Guard.

8. <u>Discuss District business at the Water Department; may include topics pertaining to financial, procurements and operations at the Water Dept.</u>

Mary McCoy states the initial training for the new billing software has taken place.

The 1.7 million dollar bond for the Cranberry Highway project will be coming through the beginning of October.

9. <u>Clerk-Treasurer's Report which may include Health Insurance, Retirement and Financial Topics</u>

Bruce Almeida will begin the audit of the books in the next week. There will also be an audit conducted of the OPEB account.

As a follow up to the suggestion of forming a Committee to discuss the disposal or future use of the fire station at 5 E Central once the new station is occupied Mary McCoy states she spoke with Attorney Dan Murray. Attorney Murray does not recommend forming a Committee and would like the Prudential Committee to put an Article back in the Warrant.

Mary McCoy states the tax payments are much lower this year compared to last and the spending of free cash has to be closely monitored.

The last payment on the ladder truck is being sent out.

There is discussion about cleaning the property at 240 Onset Ave that is owned by the District. Chief Goodwin states he will send a crew over to clean up so the District does not have to pay someone to do it.

10. <u>Discuss handout from Len Gay regarding the Fire Station at 5 E Central Ave and possible future of the fire station once the new one is complete</u>

At the last meeting of the Prudential Committee citizen Len Gay had given the Committee a breakdown of lots associated with the Fire Station at 5 E Central Ave and a brief history about the property and the permitted usage of the land. There is brief discussion about the options for the property. General consensus is to either dispose of the property or keep it as a substation.

There is discussion about authorizing one Prudential Committee member to approve Executive Session Minutes in anticipation of periodic review for release.

3. Fire Station Building Committee's Report/ Update from OPM Joe Sullivan

David Halberstadt updates in the absence of Joe Sullivan. There is discussion regarding the recommendation of the Fire Station Building Committee to have a universal gas shut off installed at the new fire station. It is noted that on the priority list given by Chief Goodwin that this item is moderate priority, not high priority. The discussion revolves around concern about adding a moderate priority item and then not having the funds down the road for a high priority item. It is suggested to get clarity on the Chief's priority list before voting.
