The 2018 West Virginia PTA Convention will be held at the Bridgeport Conference Center, with rooms at the Wingate by Wyndham in Bridgeport. A group rate of \$80 (plus applicable taxes) is available to convention attendees. In order to receive the group rate, **please book your overnight lodging directly with the hotel** <u>no later</u> <u>than April 2, 2018</u>. Remember to identify "CGPTA1" to receive the discounted rate! Price includes double occupancy and increases \$10.00 per person with a maximum of four (4) people per room. For example, four people in a room would cost \$100.00. The Wingate by Wyndham has complimentary parking and wireless Internet throughout the building.

There are refrigerators and microwaves in all rooms. The hotel also provides complimentary breakfast for all hotel guests, as well as popcorn and cookies throughout the day. Take 81 North and turn onto I-70W Exit, Exit 4B, toward Hancock. Merge onto I-68W, Exit 1A on the left toward Cumberland. Merge on to 79 South toward Fairmont/Clarksburg. Take Exit 124, Jerry Dove Drive and turn left off the exit on WV279. Turn left at the 2nd light onto Conference Center Drive. Follow Conference Center Drive left and follow it the Wingate by Wyndham and the Bridgeport Conference Center.

Directions from the Western Region:

Merge onto US-50 East toward Clarksburg. Merge onto I-79N toward Fairmont. Take exit 124, Jerry Dove Drive. Turn right on to WV279. Take a left at the next light on to Conference Center Drive. Follow Conference Center Drive left and follow it the Wingate by Wyndham and the Bridgeport Conference Center.

Directions from the Southern Region:

Merge onto I-70 East toward New Stanton. Merge onto I-79 South via /Exit 21 toward I-79 South/Morgantown. Stay on I-79 South and take Exit 124, Jerry Dove Drive and turn left off the exit on WV279. Turn left at the 2nd light onto Conference Center Drive. Follow Conference Center Drive left and follow it the Wingate by Wyndham and the Bridgeport Conference Center.

Katlin Thorsell, 2018 West Virginia Teacher of the Year

Katlin Thorsell is an agriculture teacher at Washington High School in Charles Town, West Virginia and the 2018 West Virginia Teacher of the Year. While her main interest is in animal science, she teaches courses in Introduction to Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, Companion Animal Care, Greenhouse Production and Horticulture. She also serves as a FFA advisor and helps her students develop their leadership potential and grow as individuals.

She received her Masters of Science from West Virginia University in Agriculture with an emphasis on Agriculture and Extension Education. Through her classroom experiences, she has developed an interest in special education and autism and has received additional teaching endorsements in those areas. Thorsell has served on her school's Local School Improvement Council and Guidance Advisory Council and was elected as president of the Faculty Senate. She was the 2015 Teacher Turn the Key representative for West Virginia at the National Association of Agriculture Educators Convention and she currently holds the office of reporter for the West Virginia Association of Agriculture Educators. She serves her community as a volunteer firefighter and EMT as well as a member of the Jefferson County Fair Board of Directors.

She credits a love for the agriculture industry and the insistence of her own high school FFA advisor for her career choice in education. Thorsell hopes that every day she creates a warm and welcoming environment in her classroom and that when her students leave the halls of Washington High School behind, they will always remember that they have someone who truly believes in them.

"Poverty in West Virginia: How it Effects Schools and PTAs" Saturday, April 21, 2018 – General Session 2

We will be hosting a panel discussion on poverty and how it effects our schools and PTAs.

All PTA members are eligible to be credentialed to vote in the business portions of the Annual West Virginia PTA Convention. The West Virginia PTA Bylaws state:

Article XIX, Section 2. Voting Body.

- a. The meetings of the West Virginia PTA convention shall be open to all members, upon payment of a registration fee determined by the West Virginia PTA Executive Committee, but the privilege of making motions, debating, and voting shall be limited to members of the board of managers, presidents of county councils or alternates chosen by their councils and accredited delegates or alternates from each local PTA unit. A voting member shall have but one vote although entitled to vote in any of several capacities. The courtesy of the floor may be extended to registered visitors and guest speakers at the discretion of the chair.
- b. Each local unit in good standing as shown by March 1 current year by the books of the state treasurer, shall be entitled to be represented at the West Virginia PTA convention by its president or alternate and by one voting delegate or alternate for every twenty-five (25) members, or fraction thereof.
- c. Each council president, or their alternate chosen by the council is a voting member of the West Virginia PTA convention.

SPECIAL NOTE:

We will not be mailing out "voting credential cards" in this Call to Convention. In the past, these cards needed to be filled out and signed by the Local Unit/County Council President and the delegate and presented at the registration table.

We have added a section to the registration form which indicates if you are registering as a voting delegate. Your unit president **MUST** sign the registration form in the appropriate place to confirm your eligibility to vote on behalf of your unit. Eliminating this extra step will save the West Virginia PTA money on printing and postage, which can now be allocated in more efficient ways.

See chart above to determine how many voting delegates to which your unit is entitled. Your PTA may and is encouraged to send additional attendees to Convention above the number of your entitled voting delegates. Even though they will not be eligible to vote, the convention is a valuable experience for all PTA members and they will still receive training and workshop experiences. **If your local unit or county council submits registration forms with voting delegates that exceed the total number allowed, we will contact the President of your unit to make the appropriate corrections.** If you have any questions, please contact the office by emailing <u>office@westvirginiapta.org</u>.

Upon presentation of your membership card at the registration desk at Convention, each voting delegate shall receive their voting delegate card, which is the card that signifies their voting status during this convention. Delegates have the opportunity to vote on decisions that affect West Virginia PTA and local PTAs, including their leadership and organizational structure. It is very important to ensure that every local unit is represented at convention. The items presented to the convention delegates can be found in this Call to Convention.

2018 West Virginia PTA Convention Registration Form

A separate form is required for each registrant. This form may be duplicated. Advanced Registration must be received by April 2, 2018, to receive discounted registration fees.
