Genesee County Home Improvement/Urgent Repair Program – Nichole Odette

The Genesee County Home Improvement & Urgent Repair Program provides qualified homeowners in Genesee County outside the City of Flint with a Deferred Payment Loan (DPL) to make needed improvements to their homes with no monthly interest or principal payments. Repairs can include roofing, windows, furnaces, wells, electrical, plumbing repairs and more. Payback is required when the owner no longer lives in the home/transfers ownership/vacates the property. If the owner is 62 years of age or older, then after five years the loan is forgiven. HUD is the Federal Tax dollars at work.
