We need to stand up for Christ and share our faith in him with others. I just read that in 2016 almost 90,000 Christians were martyred for their faith. That's about one every 6 minutes. That makes Christians the most persecuted (and most populous) religious group in the world. About 70% of that violence is occurring in Africa, but we are all well aware of increased threats at home. Let us pray and work for peace and justice in our homes, our community, and in the world.

One my favorite Bible passages from the Advent and Christmas season is Isaiah 9: 6 which reads: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Wouldn't it be wonderful if we had Jesus running our government and the governments of the world? Let us pray for our own government in this transition year that God would give our new officials the wisdom and discernment and ethical/moral guidance that they so desperately need in order to be able govern us well.

And may we remember that no matter what, God is in control somehow, and He loves us dearly. Let us cling to that truth, and follow in Christ's footsteps in the New Year as closely as possible.

# CHRISTNET WARMING CENTER TRENTON FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH FEBRUARY 19 - FEBRUARY 26, 2017



## WHAT IS THE CHRISTNET MINISTRY?

ChristNet is a downriver organization providing basic, needed services to people who need safe, secure, temporary overnight shelter during the cold winter months. The ChristNet program maintains a weekly rotating shelter involving the cooperation of over fifty churches and numerous civic organizations in the downriver area. The shelter program starts the 1st week of October each year, and runs to June the following year. The following brief summary on the homeless problem in our country, and in our state, is provided for your information. With our current economic environment, the situation is not expected to improve in the near future

# How do we know whom we will GET?

The registration process for guests takes place

at the ChristNet downriver intake center located in Taylor. Guests are screened and evaluated each

Church will again be hosting the CHRISTNET WARMING Center week for one beginning 2/19/2017 thru 2/26/2017. With assistance from several other local area churches and civic organizations, this will be the 21<sup>th</sup> consecutive year our church family will be providing a safe, secure and warm shelter for many homeless people from the downriver area.

night before they are allowed to enter the program. Typically, we will have approximately 25 - 30 guests (men, women and families with children are the possible make-up of guests). Guests are transported to the host site for the evening, and picked up the following morning for return to the intake center area.

# HOW LONG WILL OUR GUESTS BE WITH US EACH DAY?

They will arrive about 6:30 p.m. and will depart from our building at about 6:30 a.m. the following morning. Most of the time our guests will be sleeping, but your help is needed in "behind

the scenes" activities like preparing a food dish, assisting in serving meals, spending the night as hosts to supervise and assist our guests, etc.

"I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me a drink; I was a stranger and you received me in your homes, naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me... I tell you, whenever you did this for one of the least important of these brothers of mine, you did it for me!" (Matthew 25:35-36, 40)

#### WHAT WILL WE BE DOING FOR OUR GUESTS?

The goal of CHRISTNET is to provide a safe, secure overnight shelter for those in need. We'll serve a hot evening meal, provide a safe night of rest, give them a simple early morning breakfast, and a sack lunch. We'll also be a friend to them and share Christ's love with them in a tangible way.

#### WHAT CAN I DO TO HELP?

Volunteers are needed to assist in the following capacities:

- To spend all, or part, of a night at the church (teams of two or three people are needed to serve as hosts for our guests in the building during the hours of 9 p.m. to 7 a.m.).
- To assist in serving and/or preparing dishes (either at church or at home) for evening meals (Menu suggestions will be provided.)
- To prepare and set out a simple, nourishing breakfast in the mornings.
- To prepare appetizing bag lunches for guests.
- To assist in early morning cleanup.
- To provide laundry service during the week and at week's end.
- Site preparation of the area for guests on Sunday, February 19th; and - take-down and transport of supplies to next host site on the following Sunday, February 26th, 2017).
- Monetary contributions are always welcome to help cover church expenditures for this ministry.
