ORDINANCE NO. 01-2018

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT MARIHUANA ESTABLISHMENTS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF MORLEY

WHEREAS, the Michigan electorate voted to enact the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act by popular vote on November 6, 2018, and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that "a municipality may completely prohibit or limit the number of marihuana establishments within its boundaries," and

WHEREAS, the Village Council intends to "opt out" of the voter approved Act with regard to marihuana establishments, defined in the Act as a marihuana grower, marihuana safety compliance facility, marihuana processor, marihuana microbuisness, marihuana retailer, marihuana secure transporter, or any other type of marihuana-related business licensed by the department, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE VILLAGE OF MORLEY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That as authorized by Section 6.1 of the Act all marihuana establishments as defined in the Act are prohibited within the boundaries of the Village of Morley.

Section 2. The Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in the Pioneer, and this ordinance shall be effective upon publication.
