

**PARKING CONTROL ORDINANCE #11-02**  
**THE VILLAGE OF MORLEY ORDAINS**

**SECTION 1.1: PURPOSE**

This ordinance is intended to control and regulate parking in the Village of Morley, Mecosta County, Michigan during snow removal season.

**SECTION 1.2: DEFINITIONS**

Business District shall be defined as:

Fourth Street alley west to Cass Street.

Fourth Street south to First Street.

Fourth Street north to end of bank on east side and to Kitson office on west side.

**SECTION 1.3: LIMITATIONS ON PARKING**

- (A) Overnight parking on streets between November 1 and April 1.

No motor vehicle shall be parked on any street within the Village of Morley after 2:00 A.M. and prior to 6:00 A.M. between November 1 of any year and April 1 of the following year. Where public streets are not defined by curbing, it shall be deemed unlawful to park any vehicle during the time stated in this subsection within a distance of 20 feet of the center of the useable roadway except for the following:

Emergency services personnel (Fire and Police) in the vicinity of the police station and the fire station.

- (B) Parking in the business district shall be for two hours.

Business district defined in Section 1.2.

**SECTION 1.4: VIOLATIONS**

Any person who violates any provision herein shall be responsible for a civil infraction.

**SECTION 1.5: PENALTY**

A fine of not more than \$60.00 and/or the vehicle towed at owner expense. In the event of continuing violation of ordinance, each subsequent act of violation shall constitute a separate offense under the terms of this ordinance and may be so charged.

**SECTION 1.6: SEVERABILITY CLAUSE**

- (A) The sections of this ordinance shall be deemed to be severable and should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any other part thereof, other than the part so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.


**SECTION 1.7: EFFECTIVE DATE**


Effective date of this ordinance shall be the date of publication or the twentieth (20) day after its passage, whichever occurs first.
