ORDINANCE NO. 42

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE SEMITRUCK PARKING

THE VILLAGE OF MORLEY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Definitions. For the purpose of this Ordinance:

The term "Semitruck" means a Semitractor/trailer Rig or its components. This means a Semitractor, Semitrailer, and/or Pup, in any combination or alone, hereinafter referred to in this ordinance as a "Semi." Whiche - see 10,000 to ohmerce at

The term "Parking Lot" refers to an asphalt or bituminous surfaced public parking lot hereinafter referred to as a "Parking Lot," and is in no way intended to be construed to include a gravel or concrete surfaced Parking Lot.

Section 2. Rules and Regulations. No semi shall drive through, stop, stand or park in any Parking Lot. If the driver of the Semi driving through or parking in a Parking Lot can readily be determined he/she shall be held responsible to pay all fines and costs, and to remove the Semi immediately. If the driver of the Semi driving through or parking in a Parking Lot is indeterminable, the lessor and/or owner of the Semi shall be held responsible to pay all fines and cost, and to remove or oversee the removal of the Semi within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt of a certified letter notifying them of the infraction.

If a Serni that has received a citation has not been removed after twenty-four (24) hours of receiving that citation, a second citation may be attached and another citation for each subsequent twenty-four (24) period of infraction; however at no time can a citation be added to a citation that was issued less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the subsequent citation being issued.

Section 3. Fines and Penalties. The fine for the infraction of this ordinance shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense.

If a Semi has violated this Ordinance for ninety-six (96) consecutive hours, <u>AND/OR</u>, has been observed by a Police Officer as having violated this ordinance three (3) or more times in any twelve (12) consecutive month period, <u>AND/OR</u>, a citation that was issued at least thirty (30) days is unpaid, a wheel lock may be applied to the Semi and instructions left on the Semi in a prominent location to contact any one (1) of three (3) Village board members or employees who will each have a key and remove the wheel lock after all fines and penalties have been paid.

Section 4. Conflicting Provisions. In the event of any conflict between this Ordinance and the provisions of any prior ordinances, then the provisions of this Ordinance shall take precedence.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its

Publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the Village of Morley and after proper signs have been posted.

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE COMMERCIAL VERICLE PARKING: ORDINANCE NO 42 THE VILLAGE OF MORLEY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Definitions. For the purpose of this Ordinance:

The term "Commercial Vehicle" means any Commercially Licensed vehicle having a Ten Thousand (10,000) pound or greater GVW (Gross Vehicle Weight), hereinafter referred to in this ordinance as a "Truck."

The term "Parking Lot" refers to an asphalt or bituminous surfaces public parking lot hereinafter referred to as a "Parking Lot" and is no way intended to be construed to include a gravel or concrete surfaced Parking Lot.

Section 2. Rules and Regulations. No truck shall drive through, stop, stand, or parking any Parking Lot. If the driver of the truck driving through or parking in a Parking Lot can readily be determined, he/she shall be held responsible to pay all fines and costs, and to remove the truck immediately. If the driver of the truck driving through or parking in a Parking Lot is indeterminable, the lessor and/or owner of the truck shall be held responsible to pay all fines and costs, and to remove or oversee the removal of the truck within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt of a certified letter notifying them of the infraction. If a truck that has received a citation has not been removed after twenty-four [24] hours of receiving that citation, a second citation may be attached and another citation for each subsequent twenty-four (24) hour period of infraction; however, at no time can a citation be added to a citation that was issued less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the subsequent citation being issued.

Section 3. Fines and Penalties. Violation of this ordinance shall be a civil infraction and shall be punishable by a fine of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense. If a truck has violated this Ordinance for ninety-six (96) consecutive hours, AND/OR has been observed by a Police Officer as having violated this ordinance three (3) or more times in any twelve (12) consecutive month period, AND/OR a citation that was issued at least thirty (30) days before is unpaid, a wheel lock may be applied to the truck and instructions left on the truck in a prominent location to contact any one (1) of three (3). Village board members or employees who will each have a key and remove the wheel lock after all fines and penalties have been paid.

Section 4. Conflicting Provisions. In the event of any conflict between this Ordinance and the provisions of any prior ordinances, then the provisions of the Ordinance shall take precedence.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after a publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the Village of Modes and after a signs have been posted.
