Village of Morley Residents,


Summer has finally arrived! We hope you are enjoying it.

Also, the Village can only collect taxes through September 14. Then, the tax information is given to Mecosta County to collect delinquent taxes. Since September 14 is on a Thursday this year, the Village office will be open on that day from 9 to 5.

Village of Morley Clean-Up 2022 Begins April 1 and ends October 31

Leaves, Grass Cuttings, & Brush will be picked up April through October. On the FIRST MONDAY of each month brush will be collected. Please do not stack the brush too high (under one foot) and put the butt ends toward the road. On the THIRD MONDAY of each month leaves will be collected. Yard waste must be in biodegradable/compostable bags (no regular plastic trash bags accepted). Brown paper yard waste bags and/or "Bag to Nature" 100% compostable plastic bags are available at Wal-Mart, Lowe's, Menard's, etc. Stack bags and brush at your curb. Please be considerate of our maintenance worker by loading bags that one person can easily carry. PLEASE DO NOT BRING YOUR ITEMS TO THE MAINTENANCE BUILDING OR ANY OTHER VILLAGE SITE—VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED.

Please Note: We will NOT be collecting your normal kitchen garbage and we will NOT be collecting "bulky" items, such as lawn chairs, furniture, appliances, etc. Because the Village has contracted with Republic Services so you can obtain rubbish service at a greatly reduced amount, these items can be collected by them (as long as you have obtained service through them).

No Hazardous Materials are accepted at any of the Cleanups: No Liquids, Paint, Concrete, Shingles, Tires, etc. are accepted. Mecosta County Household Hazardous Waste Collection will be Thursday, August 3, from 4 to 8 PM, at the Mecosta County Fairgrounds. 

Tree Planting in our Parks

Around 20 volunteers met on Saturday, April 29 to plant trees at the three Village parks. Funds for the trees was provided through a Michigan Department of Natural Resources grant under the Urban and Community Forestry Program.



An Oak tree and three River Birch were planted at Latimer Park, six Dogwood and Redbud were planted at Kinney Park, and four Maple and Mountain Ash were planted at the Clyde Clark Park (dam). These trees will provide shade and contribute to the parks' beauty.

An additional Maple tree was provided to the Morley Fire

Department and was planted at the Fire Station in memory of former Fire Chief Dan Deyo.
