Summer is past and fall is here with its beautiful colors! Please take time to read this newsletter and find all the Fall activities planned for the Village

This summer the Village of Morley installed a new section of sidewalk along Cass Street, extending to 9th Street. This was done because so many people were walking to the Dollar Store and there was no sidewalk after the driveway at the Community Center.



The Village Council amended the Blight Ordinance at their September meeting. Please read the addition concerning temporary living quarters (page 2).

As you have probably seen, the White Pine Trail is being paved through a ARPA grant from the State of Michigan to the Friends of the White Pine Trail and DNR. Plans are to have the paving done through our area by the end of Fall.

The Village has had Republic Services handle the residential trash pickup for the last six years. Their contract will expire on January 30, 2024. The Village is now taking bids for the refuse service with a deadline of October 30 for bidding. The service provides residents with a cheaper rate for their trash pickup. We will notify you who won the bid, the cost for cart and bag service, and other information, in our January newsletter, website and Facebook page.

Changes in Blight Ordinance

The following changes were made in the Reduction or Elimination of Blight Ordinance (01-2017) at the September 11 Council meeting:

Add Section 4 (G) Temporary Living Quarters – Recreational vehicles including motor homes, tiny homes, travel trailers, fifth wheels, and popup campers may not be used as permanent living quarters within the Village of Morley. Temporary use of the aforementioned vehicles of thirty (30) days or less per resident in one calendar year is permitted. Any temporary use of the aforementioned vehicles will need proper hookups to water and sewer or be self-contained. The exception to this restriction is Mecosta Pines Campground and any other campground the Village of Morley Council deems authorized.

Changes in Seasonal Activities

Brush and leaves will continue to be picked up through October. Then our machinery is changed in anticipation of winter. On the FIRST MONDAY of each month brush will be collected. Please do not stack the brush too high (under one foot) and put the butt ends toward the road. On the THIRD MONDAY of each month leaves will be collected. Yard waste must be in biodegradable/compostable bags (no regular plastic trash bags accepted). Brown paper yard waste bags and/or "Bag to Nature" 100% compostable plastic bags are available at Wal-Mart, Lowe's, Menard's, etc. Stack bags and brush at your curb. Please be considerate of our maintenance worker by loading bags that one person can easily carry. PLEASE DO NOT BRING YOUR ITEMS TO THE MAINTENANCE BUILDING OR ANY OTHER VILLAGE SITE—VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED.

PARKING IN STREETS



Don't forget-there is NO parking on Village streets from November 1-April 1 from 2:00-6:00 AM to accommodate for snow plowing.
