We were stunned by your generosity as we welcomed two new kids into our family. And I am humbled by your compassion, service, and love as we have adjusted to being a family of five. We know that we are loved, and I want you to know that we appreciate everything you have done for us over the past few months.

As we continue our 'mission' discussions during our quarterly meeting, I have been struck by this recurring question: Could our church learn to love our community as deeply, passionately, and actively as they have loved my family over these past few months? One of our core values here at Dover First Christian church is to "Be Light." This means that we want to take the love and grace of Jesus into our dark world. We have that core value because Jesus repeatedly calls us to love each other, to love our neighbor, and even to love our enemies.

It's easy for us to get so busy with our lives that we forget there a lot of kids in our community dealing with abuse and neglect. There are a lot of widows grieving the loss of their spouse. There are a lot of people living in poverty and struggling to make ends meet. I know that we cannot do everything, but we must begin to have the conversation about how we, as a church, can share Christ's love with our city and our county.

Last quarter we talked about ways to connect with our community through outreach events and inviting friends, but this quarter we'd like to focus on how we, like Jesus, can minister to the hurting around us.

Here are some questions we will be discussing during the meeting:

- 1. What areas of need do you know about in our community? How could we best meet those needs?
- 2. Are there organizations we could partner with to better help serve those in need?
- 3. What does it mean for us, as a church, to "love our neighbors?" How are we doing this? Can we do it any better?

Please be in prayer over the next several days as we prepare for this discussion. If you plan to attend, please come prepared to have a meaningful conversation, seasoned with grace, as we seek to honor God together.









