Out of those meetings came three core values that we want to focus on as we move forward as a church. This process culminated in our most reason sermon series where we explored the three beliefs that lie at the core of our identity as a church.

First, we want to be a church that loves. God has loved us so much that He sent His son for us, and we are called to love like that. We want to be a church that loves God with all that we are, and that means that we need to learn how to love the people He puts in our life.



Secondly, we need to be light in the darkness of our world. This means that we live the kind of transformed life that makes people want to meet our Lord. It means that we put to death the desires of the darkness, and learn to

live according to light; when we do this, we hold out hope to fallen world.

Finally, we want to be a church that grows disciples. We aren't in the business of growing church attenders, program leaders, or mere Bible scholars. We want to guide people into a growing relationship with Jesus so they can become fully mature followers of Jesus Christ.
