We believe God has been working in the hearts and lives of different people over the past several months, and helping to heal some old wounds as well as ignite new passions. We cannot wait to see where he leads us in 2020 and beyond, and we want to begin discussing what we want our church to look like in the future. What are our dreams for three years, five years, or ten years? What practical things we can do to start moving that direction?

Before we do that, however, we'd like to spend an extended time in prayer. If you join us for our March 7, quarterly Prayer and Praise meeting, we will cover some of the normal business things we need to address, and we will begin the process of putting together some 'dream statements.' A lot of our time, however, will be spent in prayer together. We desire to earnestly praise God for what we have already seen take place, and we desperately want to seek his guidance as we take our next steps. If you plan to attend this meeting, please come with some dreams and questions, but most importantly, come with a humble heart ready to seek God in prayer together. This program is coordinated by United Way of Tuscarawas County and is a program to keep children fed outside of the school day. This will feed approximately 564 children in the Dover, Newcomerstown and Claymont School districts. We are also donating \$500.00 to the United Way of Tuscarawas County to help pay for a week's worth of meals. We will need volunteers to join in with "at risk youths" in the juvenile system to help pack the bags. There is a possibility we will also help in future weeks packaging.
