OAK TREE WILT:

Springtime may seem like a great time to get outside with a chainsaw and prune everything in sight, but don't make that mistake with your oak trees.

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources asks property owners to "please wait" when it comes to pruning oak trees. From April 15 to July 15, the species is at high risk for oak wilt, a serious fungal disease that can kill red oak trees within a few weeks. The disease also weakens white oaks.

STORM DRAIN:



Do Not Pollute Into Our Storm Drains or Any Other Outdoor Drain!

You might not be able to see the stream, lake or ground water from your house, but it's there! It might be a small stream or ditch or the storm drain in the street. These lead directly to our lakes, streams and ground water. What we do at home affects our water. So, any oil, pet waste, leaves that enters a storm drain gets into our lakes, rivers and grounds water without being treated. We all need to be aware of what goes into our storm drains.

An illicit discharge is anything that drains to a storm drain or directly to the river and is not stormwater. An illicit discharge can be dumping motor oil, household cooking oil, food, or even a spill that goes into the storm drain. As a community member, you play a large role in identifying and reducing illicit discharges in your community.

What Can You Do About Illicit Discharges?

You can help keep our lakes, rivers, streams, wetlands, and groundwater clean by applying the following tips:

- Keep it clean. Whether in the street or in your yard, remember to keep leaves, grass clippings, trash, and fertilizers away from storm drains.
- Only rain in the drain. Never dump motor oil, chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain. All of these materials pollute our lakes, rivers and ground water!
- Clean it. Clean up after your pet to reduce pet waste traveling to local waterways.
- Dispose of it properly. When not stored, used or disposed of properly, household hazardous waste may pollute our waters.
- Household cleaners, paints, automotive fluids and more should be recycled at a household hazardous waste event or designated collection facility.

ODD/EVEN WATERING OF LAWNS:



Properties with addresses that are even (the last number in your address), water on calendar days that are even. Properties with addresses that are odd, water on calendar days that are odd. There will be some even folks that are concerned about getting cheated because if there are 31 days in the month, there are two odd days in a row. Any 31st day of the month will be a "wild card" day and both odd and even addresses can water. However, they are being asked to apply only 50% of the irrigation water that they would normally apply on their normal watering day.

Residents with underground sprinkling are ok to water as they normally would in accordance with the times on the irrigation signed contract that is on file with the office and EGLE. (Any resident with underground sprinkling MUST have a signed contract on file).
