WATER FLUSH NOTICE:



THIS IS TO NOTIFY YOU THAT WE WILL BE FLUSHING THE WATER SYSTEM ON WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 19,20 & 21, 2023 FROM APPROXIMATELY 8 AM TO 4 PM.

The purpose of flushing is to remove iron and other deposits from inside of the water pipes. It is normal for the water to become cloudy, and/or rusty during the flushing.

THEREFORE, WE RECOMMEND YOU AVOID ACTIVITIES SUCH AS WASHING CLOTHES DURING THIS PERIOD.

You may want to store up a small amount of drinking water until the water clears. If you notice a change in your water quality after we flush, open up all the COLD water taps in your home and let them run until the water runs clear.

WEEKLY INSPECTIONS:

We try our very best to complete inspections at least once a week and to complete Spring Inspections once a year. The reason we do inspections is to keep the community neat and orderly and to ensure homes and lots are being properly maintained. When we do weekly inspections, we will send an email to notify you of what needs correction, we give you ample time to correct (normally 6 days), on the 7th day we come back by an do a recheck inspection. If you fail to complete the inspection, we require you to meet with management for an explanation before we take the next step.

When doing inspections we look for many things:

- Vehicles must be licensed and in proper running order, no flat tires, vehicles are not permitted to be repaired in the community.
- Trash left out (or not inside your trash cart), it attracts cats, skunks, raccoons and opossums.
- · Toys left out when not in use all toys should be put neatly away and out of sight.
- Oil stains on street/driveway or leaking vehicles which will seep into the ground & our water supply.
- Open or damaged skirting which allows cats and other animals to live under your home and at times get inside your home.
- Mow, water, edge and/or weed whack lawn. If you have weeds, we suggest using weed and feed to maintain or remove them. We do expect all homes and lots to be mowed at least once a week to maintain your lawn no taller than 3".
- Campers, boats, trailers etc are to be at your homesite for loading and unloading purposes only.
- Indoor furniture is not permitted to be outdoors.
- · Wash your home and be sure your site is picked up and orderly.

Spring Inspections are a more intense inspection where we complete a more thorough evaluation of back yards, if homes need painting, sheds need rebuilding, any repairs needed, etc.

We do give ample time to correct but if you fail to correct and issues are not completed we have not choice but to take further action each week.

SKUNKS:

Occasional skunk sightings in a neighborhood are not a cause for alarm. Because skunks are generally easy-going, they will not intentionally bother people. In fact, skunks may benefit humans by eating many insects and rodents many regard as pests.

Though skunks are most commonly known for their strong musky smell, they could cause damage to your property by digging up the lawn searching for grubs. Much like the raccoon, they are opportunistic eaters and have a varied diet. They will occasionally raid garbage, eat personal animal food, grubs, bugs, or anything else they deem edible. Occasionally, they will seek shelter and den under sheds, decks, and wood piles or homes with open skirting. Attacks from a skunk are very unlikely, considering their first line of defense is to spray.

Because of the lingering odor, and fear of being sprayed, it may be hard for some people to tolerate skunks living under a deck or shed. But skunks need shelter when they are most vulnerable (during the coldest parts of the winter and when raising young).

Skunks use their powerful defense only when they or their young are threatened and cannot escape. Even then, they give ample warning that should be heeded — stamping front feet, a raised tail, hissing, short forward charges and twisting their hind end around in your direction. Spotted skunks will even contort into a characteristic handstand, rump in the air with eyes still fixed on the threat. Move away slowly and quietly. By nature, dogs tend to ignore these warnings, so it is important they be restrained for their own good.

Skunks are nocturnal and non-aggressive, plus they play a beneficial role—all good reasons to just leave them alone until they have moved on of their own accord (which they readily do) or can safely be encouraged to leave an area where they are not wanted.

Exclusion techniques should be used proactively to prevent denning <u>before</u> an animal moves in. Any suspected skunk den should first be checked to determine if it has residents. This may be done by loosely filling the hole (or holes) with soil, leaves, straw, crumpled paper or similar material. If a skunk is present, the animal will easily push their way out overnight and reopen the hole. If the plug remains undisturbed for two or three nights, it is safe to assume that the hole is unoccupied and can be filled. In the winter, skunks may remain inactive for longer periods, so provide them with a bit more time to disturb the plug before blocking the den entrance.

Prevention and control tips:

- Remove food sources like bird feeders, any personal animal food and ensure that garbage is securely tied and tucked into your trash container with the lid closed.
- Check the yard before letting your dogs out at night. Make sure there are no skunks nearby that could potentially spray your animals.
- If a skunk is denning under your porch, be sure your lattice reaches from the ground to the deck to keep the skunk out. You might also try placing an ammonia-soaked towel into the den opening. The unpleasant smell will draw the skunks out.



MOTORCYCLES, MOTORIZED SCOOTERS/CYCLES, SNOWMOBILES

- Motorcycles and motorized scooters/bikes may be ridden into or out of the community and must be properly licensed for street use.
- 2. Motorized bicycles can be ridden without the use of the motor.
- 3. No changing of oil, minor or major repairs are permitted.
- 4. If you park your motorcycle on the street on a temporary basis, please use a metal plate under the kickstand to prevent damage to the asphalt.
- 5. No dirt bikes, unlicensed motorcycles or motorized cycles/scooters are allowed.
- 6. Snowmobiles are to be left in the RV storage area and not driven on the owner's home site or anywhere within the community.

GOLF CARTS

- 1. Golf Carts may be operated on the community streets.
- 2. They must be driven by licensed adults.



- Golf Carts cannot be driven to become an annoyance to other residents and cannot disturb the quiet enjoyment of his or her own home.
- Golf Carts operated upon the streets shall abide by all laws and rules of the road applicable to motor vehicle traveling on the community streets.
- 5. The number of passengers shall be limited to the designed seating capacity of the golf cart.
- 6. No loud or bypassed mufflers are permitted.
